SPOTTED LANTERNFLY

The spotted lanternfly is an invasive insect found in Michigan. It can harm fruit crops and trees and be a nuisance. If you see one, take a picture, squish it and report it.



This pest is a hitchhiker and will travel or lay eggs on cars, outdoor equipment, firewood and more.

LIFE CYCLE

Watch for the different life cycle stages of the spotted lanternfly:



Egg Mass

About 1 ½ inches long

Found on outdoor surfaces from trees to vehicles. Looks like waxy chewing gum.

Most visible: **September to May**



Juvenile

¼-½ inch long

Found on a wide variety of plants and trees.

Most visible: **May to September**



Adult

About 1 inch long

Found on orchard trees, grapevines, oaks, pines and other host plants.

Most visible: **August to October**
